You will qualify for a Disabled Parking Permit if you meet any of the following criteria:

You are confined to a wheelchair.

You're unable to walk without assistance from another person or an assistive device. Note that any assistive device that significantly restores your ability to walk to a point that your limitation is no longer severe will negate your eligibility for the handicapped parking permit.

You need to use portable oxygen. Additionally, it is possible to qualify even if you do not have to keep oxygen with you if your doctor confirms that your condition warrants the need. There are specific guidelines that must be met for this determination.

Suffering from a professionally-diagnosed cardiac condition that meet the standards set by the American Heart Association is another possibility.

An arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition that results in a severe limitation to walk is demonstrated.

An optometrist has certified that you are legally blind.

If you meet any of these qualifications, you deserve to possess a disabled parking permit and should contact your local motor vehicle department for details. Don't forget to take your driver's license with you when you go to apply!
